How best to utilize the digitized newspapers for genealogy research?

• Know what you are looking for:

- O What question are you trying to answer?
- o When did it happen?
- o Where did it happen?
- O What name?

To get started you need to learn

- What papers were published in the area?
- Where were they published?
- When were they published?
- What still exists?
- Where can I find them?

What papers were published?

- Library of Congress Chronicling America
 - US Newspaper Directory, 1690-Present (What exists)
 - Search by State and County
 - Choose Dates range or leave as is
 - Click on a title for details: Volume and issues published

Where to find digitized newspapers

- Local library not usually digitized
- University library– some are digitized
- State Archives not usually digitized
- State Newspaper Repository some are digitized

- Search by city, county, or state or a combination of city and state or county and state and add "historical newspapers" or "online newspapers" or "digitized newspapers"
 - Search for Van Wert, Iowa historical newspapers
 - Search for Ohio historic online newspapers
 - Search: Historical newspapers https://sites.google.com/site/onlinenewspapersite/Home/

What are the best web sites for ease of use?

- Depends on your computer skills.
- Most are fairly easy to navigate for viewing.

- Searches can be very different from site to site.
- Look for a "HELP" button or tab for an explanation of the site and tips for using it.

Are Digitized newspapers available through the Family History Centers?

- There are not any newspapers at
 - Family History Centers
 - FamilySearch.org
 - o Family History Library for the United States.
- These are published by local genealogical societies and individuals and available at the Family History Library or on microfilm.
 - Newspaper abstracts
 - Indexes
 - Newspaper clippings
- Look for Newspapers under the county and state in the catalog on familysearch.org.

Which web sites have the most complete collection?

- Digitized newspapers by a sequence of years varies by the location, no one site has a complete collection.
- Each site has different newspaper titles from different locations.
- Subscription sites have contracts that must be renewed so a listing may go away.
- State newspaper repositories will have the most complete collections and sequences for that state.
- ALWAYS look at the list of newspapers on any subscription site BEFORE subscribing
- Don't waste money if they don't have newspapers in the location for the time period you need.

Similarities of newspaper websites

- Search feature
- Can download images
- Can zoom in and out
- Can view in "full screen"

Differences in newspaper websites

- Newspapers they offer
- State, county, and city they cover
- Cost: free or subscription
- Options for navigation of site
- Ability to see a preview of the page or article

Searching for Obituaries

- Search for a surname
- Don't search by a first name unless it is an unusual name too many results
- It won't show up if the name wraps in the column or is hyphenated
- Narrow the timeframe to a month or range between dates: January 26, 1898 and February 14, 1898

No results?

- Might not be in that paper
- Not that period of time
- Might not be in ANY paper
- Might be spelled differently
- Might not have been legible when the page image was OCR'd

What is OCR?

- OCR: Optical Character Recognition
- OCR is the computer program used to "read" the text in images to determine the character
- Only as good as the text in the image
 - You can't decipher a letter from smudged, broken, or crooked text
- OCR would read an image of this slide and correctly decipher the letters it is crisp and legible.
- Most newspaper and old document images are not crisp and clear
- They have
 - Smudges
 - o Smears
 - Missing or faint ink
 - Foxing (brown spots and speckles on the page)
 - Ink spots, drops, splatter
 - Colors or a variety of shades of the aging page color
 - Broken type
 - Connected lettered
 - To OCR the page Color is removed

Finding an Obituary

- Search
- Read each page of the issues beginning the day of death for a month after
- Read the paper for the day of death and check for morning and afternoon editions
- Scan each page of the newspaper including the classified section
- Look for headings like Death, Died, Obituary, Funeral
- There is the possibility it was never in a newspaper. At all. Anywhere. Ever. 😌
- Same applies to other searches in newspapers.
- Marriages: Look before the event for engagement, shower, marriage license announcements.

Search In Historical Oregon Newspapers (Search results highlight hits)

- Searched Rosecrantz in Historical Oregon Newspapers
 - 45 Results, All 1900 or later, I want April 1855 marriage
- Searched for Choate (brides name)
 - 4022 results too many to review, Joseph A. Choate is a character in a serial story
- Advance Search for Choate in 1855
 - 2 results, July 7, 1855 and December 1, 1855, Still not what I am looking for
- Searched first name of Erastus (groom) Didn't find it
 - Searched Bacon 4 results, Nope, only ads for bacon

Read the Oregon Argus - First issue published on April 21, 1855 in Oregon City

- Published each Saturday, each edition was 4 pages
- Read April 21, 28 and May 5, 1855 issues
- Found it! On same page as a hit for bacon! READ the WHOLE page.
- The Oregon Argus. (Oregon City [Or.]) 1855-1863, May 05, 1855, Image 3
