**October:** As you can see, members and visitors participated in small group discussions about







weaving family stories into the times in which they lived. Several members brought examples of their work.

was among those who came with a slave, whose name was Reuben Shipley. Nokes will be showing slides of people and events related to the slavery story in the Pacific Northwest and sharing his writing/research process.

Time commitment: 2 to 3 hrs per month



We have some new additions to our library. The book *Crash Course in Family History* by Paul Larsen was purchased by the society in honor of member Mabelle C. Martsching who passed away this year. It's a treasure trove of up-to-date information on the many ways to locate information about your family. You'll find it on the How-To cart.

Another recent addition is the book *Murray Loop:* Journey of an Oregon Family, 1808-1949 by local

author Ted W. Cox. It's the true account of Alice Phedora Murray Green and her family. Much of the story takes place in Toledo, Oregon, and other small places nearby that are familiar to all of us. Ted Cox has done a well-researched and wonderful job of weaving Green's story together with local and national events, family letters, newspaper



articles, and photos. Last month we had a workshop on writing family history. This is a wonderful example of how to do it right. This book will be on the Oregon shelf.

The complete set of *Catholic Church Records of* the *Pacific Northwest* by Harriet Duncan Munnick is now on the reference shelf. These were a gift from Shirley and Raymond Stone in memory of Raymond, a long-time Benton County genealogist. They also donated Volumes 2 and 3 of *History of Oregon, Biographical* by Charles Henry Carey and Volumes 1 to 3 of *History of the Willamette Valley, Oregon* by Robert Carlton Clark. After some anxious moments, Blyth landed wheels up on a grass runway. The landing was filmed by the squadron's flight surgeon, using his own movie camera.



John Blyth never saw the film until recently when the flight surgeon's great-nephew found the old films and converted them to digital formats, then visited Blyth to show him the videos. The visit also was recorded.
