What a month! National Genealogical Society Conference, Historic Preservation Month, and yard work!

These events, including a Camp Adair Interpretive Display, Camp Adair WWII Barracks, and the Camp Adair's Firehouse #5, were well-attended. Col (Ret) **William Gleaves** told about his time as a Communications Officer at Adair AFS. **Denny Haney**, Fire Marshal for Adair, made sure all were safe and provided a bit of history on Firehouse #5.
