Genealogy & Refugees: How They Relate to Today's World

Presented by Film Writer, Director and Producer, George Mendeluk



With the exception of indigenous peoples, everyone in the Americas can trace their ancestry to immigrants from nations around the world. Many came seeking economic opportunity or religious freedom, or to reunite with family. Others were seeking refuge from political oppression in their war-torn countries.

George Mendeluk's family were Ukrainian refugees. They eventually settled in Canada, where George grew up dreaming of making movies. George's talk is about his family's genealogy and experience, and today's connection between Russia, Ukraine, and the United States.

"Bitter Harvest," his most recent film, depicts the *Holodomor* (Ukrainian: *to kill by starvation*). In 1932-33, Stalin took all food from the Ukrainians—even that from their own kitchen gardens—to break their will and force them into communism. Millions starved to death. Papers about the Holodomor policy surfaced in 1991, when the USSR fell. Learn about it on November 19.


LEGACYFAMILY TREE Upcoming Webinars
