Is Genealogy Alive and Well in Bend?

2020 has certainly been a difficult year. Loved ones have been lost to COVID-19 and to wildfires. Our lives have been turned upside down by months of social distancing and many lost jobs. For the Bend Genealogical Society (BGS), we have been struggling to survive after all of our in-person learning, researching and socializing activities were canceled in mid-March.

Many new virtual opportunities are cropping up to take the place of in-person activities, such as Zoom meetings, email conversations, and old-fashioned phone calls or modern FaceTime calls. It's not quite the same as a hug from a friend, but probably some changes will persist in the way we do things long after the pandemic ends. Here are a few pros & cons of using virtual activities.

PROS:

- Attend a virtual meeting from anywhere you are using the internet and your device.
- Genealogy speakers from all over the world are available to the smallest societies.
- Recorded presentations are available 24-hours a day, 7-days a week, and you can usually view recorded sessions more than once to fully absorb all the content.
- After watching a program at home, you can immediately follow-up and apply what you've just learned about to your own research.

CONS:

- Without in-person attendance, we lose social interaction and the chance to hug our friends and re-connect face-to-face with colleagues.
- It can be more difficult to maintain focus and attention when sitting in front of a computer screen at home. It's easy to let your mind wander to other tasks at home.
- It can be hard to carve out dedicated time to participate in virtual meetings without interruptions from the home environment.
- Some society members or friends do not have internet access or a working laptop.

During the next few months of staying safe, we hope to learn together how to focus on the pros and minimize the cons of virtual BGS activities. Please help BGS keep genealogy alive in Bend with your participation and support. **See what's coming up on the next page!**

Chester County PA Unveils Interactive Tool to Trace Property

Just in time for the anniversary of the Battle of the Brandywine, Chester County Archives and Records Services has released a new interactive Property Atlas that helps you discover who lived on property in September 1777. It allows researchers to easily see who owned properties in 1777, and if those owners or occupants reported any losses caused by British troops during the Philadelphia Campaign of the Revolutionary War. Click here to view the Property Atlas.

Use your mouse wheel to zoom in and out. Click on a property, and a small window opens with ownership information, usually including source. The culmination of years of research by Chester County Archives staff, the project's original intent was to assist with interpretation and preser-vation of events surrounding the Battle of Brandywine.

There is a <u>Chester Co. Archives Facebook page</u> where researchers are invited to share their ancestral stories about land in the Atlas. Do you have ancestors that owned land in Chester Co., PA?

Your "Ethnicity Estimate" Doesn't Mean What You Think It Does

If you've done DNA testing, you've noticed that some testing companies have changed your "ethnicity" estimates again. Connie Brehm found an excellent article in *Wired* about this part of DNA testing. It is a long article, but well worth reading. It clearly explains the misconceptions about the term "ethnicity" and why DNA cannot really pinpoint it. Replacing the word "ethnicity" with geographic origins might be a better descriptor of the estimate, but even that is not perfect due to the nature of reference groups and computer algorithms used to determine it from your DNA. Ethnicity, the cultural identity of a group, is not a genetic trait like eye color.
