Book Looks By charlene talbot

We looked over the eight volumes of the Indiana Source Book this month. The books are sub-headed, Genealogical Material from *The Hoosier Genealogist, 1961-1966*. It is a compilation of information printed in that magazine during those years, and is well worth your time if you have Indiana ancestors. Various Indiana counties are represented in these volumes.

It should also be pointed out that most of the marriage records are indexed only by the groom's name, so if you think you have the right county, be prepared to take pains to look over the brides' names as well.

Also, not all of the sources deal exclusively with Indiana. Some years ago we happened by chance (how much of genealogy research is due to good luck?) to find a copy of our great-great-grandfather's obituary in the Midwest Christian Advocate in one of these volumes, even though he lived in Campbell County, Kentucky, a county across the Ohio River from Indiana. This Methodist publication covered a larger area than just Indiana at that time. What we found was an abstract. (We later sent for a complete copy of the obituary, but learned nothing more, except that the obituary was written by another of his sons, not our great grandfather.)

The preface to the second volume says that prior to the publication of The Hoosier Genealogist, genealogical materials were published in 1979 as *Genealogical Sources Reprinted From Indiana Magazine of History*. This book is also in our library.

If you have Indiana ancestors, don't neglect these books!



Corvallis Newspapers Project Update

This project of abstracting the births, deaths and marriages from the early Corvallis newspapers is moving along. We now have more than ten thousand alphabetized names on the Benton County website and since both the Benton County Museum and the Corvallis/Benton County Library have access to the web, it was judged unnecessary to print out hard copies of the latest addendum for those institutions. Our genealogical library in the Benton County Museum Annex has copies of all of the addenda in the notebook entitled Corvallis Newspapers Project. Seventeen reels have been finished out of the total thirty-three. The others are in various stages of being worked on, except for the last two -- July, 1925 to March, 1926 and February 1926 to September 1926. No one has as yet undertaken these last reels. Some of the unfinished reels are nearly done, and others are barely started. Our next addendum is slated for June, 2006.

Update on our LDS Family History Center

The current hours at the Family History Center are Tue-Fri 9 am-4 pm and Tuesday evenings from 7-9:30 pm. Phone 541-758-0857 ext. 8.

Probably the most popular tool they now have is: high speed internet access for their six computers with free access to the resources at www.ancestry.com.

There are a number of valuable databases available at www.ancestry.com, but perhaps the most used are the digitized census images. Many of the census years are fully indexed for easier searching.

Current data for the International Genealogical Index, the Family History Catalog, and the Ancestral File can be accessed through the LDS Church site at www.familysearch.org. This site is also available from your home computer.

The Corvallis Family History Center has various flyers, worksheets and forms to help you with your research—some are free, others are available for a nominal fee.

Films can still be ordered from the Family History Library for a small fee and read at the Center. The Center currently has one microfilm and microfiche reader/printer and four other microfilm readers, along with two or more microfiche readers. Many of their compact disc databases are now housed on their server for quick access without needing to handle the disc.

Gary went over several of the genealogy programs they have available. Perhaps the most unique is GenSmarts where you can put your data in and it analyzes it for you, suggesting areas and places to do further research.

Applegate Pioneer Museum
