Emergence of a Genealogist: Daniel Froehlich

We interviewed Daniel Froehlich while he was working as a volunteer at the Church of the Latter Day Saints' Family History Center in Corvallis. Asked when his interest in genealogy began, he said, "I was about twelve. I got my mother to take me around to talk to some old people in our family, but they all said, 'Why should a little child be interested in all this? It's not healthy.' But luckily, my mother made some notes."

Daniel graduated from high school in Corvallis in 1972, and finished at Oregon State University in 1978. His field is community nutrition. He worked for almost a year at the Robeson Jewish Home in Portland, and then moved to Israel, where he met his wife. She had grown up in Indiana and later in Arizona. "My wife had a numerous family, and I made a lot of notes, chiefly so I could keep everybody straight. My son was born in 1981. My wife died in 1982. Some time after I came back to the United States in 1989, I went to a genealogy meeting. A lady spoke on how to join the Daughters of the American Revolution. I already had a little information, thanks in part to my mother's notes. I needed guidance on how to put it all together. I've done professional work in nutrition, and knew how to do research there and how to document my sources. Genealogy wasn't so different. But people need a guiding hand, I've found."

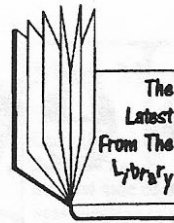
Daniel is active in the Sons of the American Revolution and is currently finishing his second term as president of Children of the American Revolution. He has been president of our Benton County Genealogical Society as well as the Linn County Genealogical Society, and has worked as a volunteer at the Family History Center for twelve or more years. He answers queries for the Oregon Jewish Genealogical Society. "I don't have a professional certificate," he says, "but I've done research for other people for pay."

He has traced most of his family lines back to Europe -- Great Britain, Germany, and Hungary. He has been to Germany a couple of times to look at some of the villages there where his ancestors came from. "I haven't worked on my own genealogy much recently," he commented. "The longer you work, the harder it gets to find new information." He also said, "It's been really convenient having early Oregon ancestors and has made the research a lot easier. The **Barton** family came to the Portland area in 1851 and the **Hensleys** came to Portland in 1852. Helping people at the Family History Center, I've found some

third and fourth cousins, and made some good friends. I can even claim a Native American branch." In April, together with his mother and his son, he is going back to a conference of collectors of pottery from a certain company in Braintree, Massachusetts. "There are about 70 people planning to attend this conference," Daniel explained, "But we're the only members that happened to have ancestors working there." His advice to beginners is, as others have said, to document your sources. But in addition, Daniel suggests that if you get information from a book, you should make a note of the library where you found it. That way, if you need to go back and look at it again, you'll know where to go. "When I make a photocopy, I write on the back of it where I got it, and the film number," he ended.
