Book Looks By charlene talbot

The NEWSPAPER GENEALOGICAL COLUMN DIRECTORY, 6th edition, by Anita Cheek Milner, is a book to check out only if you're feeling very, very lucky, and in the mood to write query letters. It is filed in our library under US. Its 110 pages seem to contain listings of all the genealogy columns that used to be printed in various newspapers, but no longer exist. In addition to all this negativism, the book was printed in 1996, so it's anybody's guess how many of the columns that are shown as still existing may have bitten the dust in the last nine years.

However, on the plus side, we did have some good luck a few years ago when we used it to send some queries. The columns are read by people who aren't ordinarily interested in genealogy, but might dip into a query if they see a familiar name.

The back of the paperback book says: "This is the 1996 edition of a collection loaded with updated information and is a good source for today's serious genealogist. The author obtained the information contained herein by surveys sent to newspaper column editors."

One query we sent was to a give-away nickel-ads sheet in Illinois. We were working on a book for the Tarvin Family Association at the time. The woman who answered the query was very helpful, even though she wasn't particularly interested in genealogy and would probably never have looked at a genealogy magazine or a web site on the Internet. She sent us a photograph of her grandparents and one of their children at a young age. We got a lot of good information from her about the next generation, such as where some of the people had moved to and what happened to them.

The book also lists miscellaneous columns, such as Australian research and regional United States.

So if you're in the mood to write letters one of these rainy days, check out this book to see if there's a column that covers the area you're researching. Incidentally, while you're in the library, you might want to get a few #9 envelopes at 5 cents each to enclose in your letters as SASEs.

New Seattle Library

Each year the BCGS inventories its library research holdings to determine which of our documents are not accounted for, and to identify errors or how we can improve our published shelf list. The inventory this year was conducted July 27, 2004. The list, which appears below, shows which volumes could not be located. All of you who have checked out BCGS library items PLEASE, PLEASE double check your genealogical material to see if any of the missing items have ended up in YOUR library. If so, we'd appreciate your returning these at your earliest convenience.

Of our total inventory of approximately 2300 volumes about 50 items could not be located. That constitutes roughly 2% of our documents which by normal library standards is well within the acceptable range for inventories. Nevertheless, we need to continue to carefully adhere to our established "Check-in, Check-out" procedures to keep future "unaccounted-for" items to a minimum.
