Emergence of a Genealogist: Gene Kelsey

"I never had to worry about my father's family," Gene said at the start of our interview. "Grandpa Kelsey researched that. He worked on the assumption that everybody named Kelsey was a relative. Of course we know now that that isn't necessarily true. But he had a pile of letters, of which I have some copies. He wrote to everyone named Kelsey, and eventually he stumbled onto the Kelsey Kindred group. I've been in contact with them over time, and they've put out several Kelsey books. The Kelsey's were in Gold Hill, Oregon."

Gene's mother gave him a list of her family, the Stoddards. "Everything she told me has since proved to be true," he said with satisfaction. "But I didn't begin to learn how to do genealogy properly until the mid-1980s. The senior center in Albany had a class and then Elderhostel offered classes at Provo, Utah, at Brigham Young University. I took Beginning Genealogy one week, and Intermediate the next. I wouldn't recommend that -- taking those classes close together. One needs time to assimilate what one's learned. I didn't take their advanced course until two years later. At the end of it, they suggested I might like to help out at the local family history center. You didn't have to be a Mormon, they said. So I volunteered at the Family History Center here in Corvallis for a number of years. I don't do it anymore, though. My memory isn't what it was.

"At BYU their huge library had some fiches that were brand new at that time, listing all the parishes in Scotland, so I figured out from those where to look for my wife's Wallace ancestors and we took a trip there. We went to their National Archives. We told them what we wanted and they brought out the films. And they'd all been photographed by the Mormon Church! I could have stayed home and ordered them!"

However, Gene does recommend going to the old home area if you can. He went to Downing, Wisconsin, where his mother's Stoddard family had lived for a generation. In the town's only restaurant he bought a little local guidebook and discovered the town was located on what had been the family's 160-acre farm. He visited the cemetery and the church, which had been built of Stoddard lumber. In fact, the town would have been named Stoddard, except that Wisconsin already had a town by that name. He was given a square nail which supposedly came from the house. He considers the Stoddard homestead to be his most exciting find.

He admits he hasn't done much genealogy lately, having hit too many brick walls. He's also involved with other activities -- like the electric organ club and the astronomy club both of which meet on the same Saturday as the Benton County Genealogical Society, luckily in the afternoon and the evening.

He served one term as president of the Benton County Genealogical Society.

His advice to newcomer's is: Keep track of what you have been doing, even it doesn't turn out to be successful, so you won't do that search again.
