Emergence of a Genealogist: Judy Juntunen

"I'm sort of a genealogist who didn't start that way," Judy said when we interviewed her. She loves the history of the area, she explained, and she likes to help people. As a result, through the years she worked at the Benton County Museum, she learned a lot about her family, particularly the paternal side.

"I grew up on stories of my great grandfather," she said. "He lived to be 94. An older couple lived across the street from my aunt, and they liked to say, 'If he hadn't been so stubborn, he'd be alive today!' He had gone fishing, and he fell in and got wet. He was too stubborn to go home and change. They were still telling me that story after I started working at the museum. So great grandpa would have been at least 140."

At one point she got really curious about his wife, Sarah, Judy's great grandmother, curious enough to write to one of her granddaughters. She wrote that she would love to know more about Sarah, and wondered why there were no pictures or letters--no written record. Couldn't she read and write? Judy's aunt wrote back that Sarah could indeed read and write. The aunt wrote that Grandpa was a good provider, but Grandma wanted money of her own, so she raised chickens. One of the things she did with her money was buy dolls for her granddaughters, and one of them cost five dollars! (A huge sum of money for a doll, in those days.)

"That got me thinking more about the female side," Judy said. "Sarah arrived with her family in 1848. My great grandfather arrived in 1853. Sarah came with a whole migration of Belknaps. What I didn't realize was that it was a family organization. Sarah was a Hawley. Her mother, Keziah, was a Belknap."

While working at the museum Judy located a captain's chair that had belonged to Jesse Belknap, the patriarch of the clan. He rode in the chair in the wagon, so that he could be comfortable. Someone came to the museum with a tintype of Jesse Belknap and his wife. They wanted to see if the chair was the same as the one in the picture. When they were leaving, Judy said, "I have a Belknap in my family -- Keziah." It turned out that Keziah was one of Jesse's children. Judy found herself unexpectedly looking at a picture of her ancestors.

The names in Judy's various lines are those of familiar Benton County pioneers -- Rycraft, Newton, Garlinghouse, as well as Belknap.

On both sides of her family education was especially important. There was never any question but that she would go to college. Her grandfather Rycraft moved his family from Alsea to Corvallis so that his children could attend high school and then Oregon State. He became head herdsman at the college dairy barns. Her mother's father worked in the bacteriology department. Part of his job was supervising the making of ice cream from the college dairy. She recently found him in a group picture of his department.

"My family has appointed me the family historian," she said. "I've gotten all kinds of information, but when I was working I didn't have time to sort through it, or make sense of it." She has, however, been careful to stash it in archival folders.

"I have three different pictures of one great grandfather in Civil War uniform," she added. "In two pictures he's with Civil War generals. I haven't had time to sort out who they might be, but when I do, someone's going to be pleased."

She has a number of children's photos that she has picked up in antique stores, and she's thinking about a way to use them. "The clothing is one of the things that fascinates me," she explained.

"I have lots more treasure-hunting to do, and I would love to make some trips back east." On a trip to Pennsylvania some years ago she located an ancestral home which later became part of the Longwood Gardens.

Her brick wall is two forebears who were apparently both orphans. The father of one of them probably served in the War of 1812. Also there were Rycrafts who fought in the Revolution, and she would like to find a connection.

"My most favorite thing," she said in summing up, "is hearing the family stories."
