



My great-great grandfather Alois Meyer worked as a brewer possibly from when he returned from the Civil War to approximately 1874 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He was listed in the 1870 census as a brewer, single, and living in what was probably a boarding house. Nearly every renter was a brewer. He probably worked for Joseph Schlitz of Schlitz Brewing as he is listed in the same household in Milwaukee. Many of the men on the census page, including my ancestor, were from Bavaria in Germany.
