NEW ON THE BOOKSHELF

Just arrived the MAP GUIDE TO THE U.S. FEDERAL CENSUSES 1790 - 1920 By William Thorndale & William Dollarhide. Genealogical research in the census begins with identifying the county. This book will be a great help in this identification as it gives maps of the states with the county boundaries from 1790 to 1920. The old county lines are superimposed over the modern ones to highlight the boundary changes at 10 year intervals. In addition to this the book gives other information on census history, etc plus a complete list of all American counties including those now defunct or renamed.
