


Corvallis High School Memory Book Class of 1940 50 Year reunion.

MANSLAUGHTER IN BENTON COUNTY

From The Democratic Era

Fri 21 April 1871 Vol. 1 #1 East Portland, Oregon

Corvallis, April 19. A young man named White, a student of Philomath College, got into a fight yesterday at Philomath with Frank Mason, when Eli Mason, an older brother, threw a piece of iron, striking White on the head, inflicting a wound from which he died about 8 o'clock last evening.

Friday 5 May (Vol. 1&3) p 2:5

Eli Mason, the youth who killed Silas S. White, by throwing a piece of iron at him while fighting with Mason's brother at Philomath, not long since, has been commutated of manslaughter.

Friday 12 May 1871, p 3:2

The late homicide at Corvallis - Mason, who was recently convicted of the killing of White, at Philomath College, Benton County, has been sentenced to the penitentiary for one year.

Dear Mrs. Dempster:

Your letter of February 17, 1954, to the Post Office Department, regarding the post office at Calipooya, Oregon, has been referred to the National Archives and Records Service.

According to the records of the Post Office Department now in our custody, a post office was established at Calipooya, Linn County, on January 8, 1850. Its name was changed to Brownsville on May 18, 1859. Names of postmasters and dates of their appointment were:
