From Iowa Genealogical Society Newsletter: "Vital Records of Iowa" ... Iowa State Dept of Health, Lucas State Office Bldg., Des Moines, Iowa 59319 attn: Vital Records Section, Certified Copy Unit.

This office has no birth, death or marriage records before July 1, 1880. Marriage records before that date may be obtained from the county in which the event occured. Iowa's law requires a searching fee of \$6. per record search and includes one certified copy if found. If the record is not found, the fee is retained for the search and will not be refunded. Be sure the name is as it was at the time of the event and the date and place of the event is given.

From Willamette NEWS and several others: The Ohio State Dept of Vital Statistics has <u>reduced</u> the cost of their <u>Uncertified</u> birth & death records to \$1.10.
