

Books reviewed here are available for check out in our library!


In the past, books about the Mayflower have been shelved under New England at the BGS Library but now there is a separate section devoted solely to Mayflower research much like sections for the DNA, Military and Native American subjects.

The English Ancestry and Homes of the Pilgrim Fathers, Who Came to Plymouth on the Mayflower in 1620, the Fortune in 1621 and the Anne and the Little James in 1623

the Anne and the Little James in 1623 is one of the many books that are now shelved in the Mayflower section. Originally published in 1929, it was reprinted in 2002 by Heritage Books, Inc. Author Charles Edward Banks, an American medical doctor best known as a historian and genealogist of Colonial America, attempted to supplement the work of Henry Martyn Dexter and his son, Henry Morton Dexter, who had done extensive research on the Pilgrim Fathers.

lilgrim Na Brief profiles of each passenger are informative, often including relationships, places of birth, dates of birth, occupations, marriages, etc. If someone died without issue. Mr. Banks considers that to be of no genealogical value. The book is divided into sections with five chapters devoted to historical evidences. A separate section is designated for the passengers of each of the four ships, the Mayflower, the Fortune, the Anne, and the Little James. Additionally, there is a section about the female passengers. Two indexes are found in the final section. One is an index of names while the other is an index of places which is helpful in research.
